

LENTEN REGULATIONS

ABSTINENCE: The church requires all the faithful who have reached their 14th year of age to abstain totally from meat on ASH WEDNESDAY- February 14 and ALL FRIDAYS of Lent.

FASTING: All the faithful between the ages of 18 & 59 inclusive are also bound to observe the fasting regulations on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may also be taken on 2 other occasions in the course of the day. Fasting, almsgiving and prayer are the three disciplines of Lent. The faithful and the elect should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter.

REGISTRATION FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (CCD)

Children entering the 1st grade should enroll NOW in order to receive first communion in second grade—registration forms can be found at the Church entrances. Children in all

EUCHARIST

Pope Francis brings together the two parts of our liturgy when he speaks of the moment when Jesus, the Word of God, asked his disciples to take and eat, take and drink. In that one action, says Pope Francis, Word and food came together, to becomeand to offer us -- everything Jesus is and has done. We repeat this action in each Mass, and we are asked to live it outside the Church doors, nourishing one another with the words and signs and food of hope.

God of mystery and wonder, may my words be yours whenever I speak!



REFLECTION

In today's Gospel Reading from St. Mark, it is reported that Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach, but His teaching was somewhat different from that normally heard there "for he taught with authority and not as the scribes." Often those who taught in Jesus'



time (the scribes) simply quoted others, a variety of Rabbis.

However, Jesus taught with authority because He had authority. Jesus' divine message was not quoting other humans, but quoting God. Jesus was One with God so He knew what He was talking about. Jesus taught with authority because He believed what He was teaching. He was familiar with the information which allowed Him to teach boldly. People listening could perceive that this was someone Who knew.

Up until this time we have seen the Lord as the Son of Man Who submitted to His Father. He submitted to God in His Baptism, and to the Holy Spirit in the wilderness. To have authority also requires submission. We, too, are called to submit to God, but for us that is sometimes challenging because it requires humility, something that is not easy for many of us.

Later in the Gospel of John there is another account of the Lord teaching at the Temple. He is challenged, and His response is quite simply, "My teaching is not from myself; it comes from the one who sent me." We are not divine, but we, too, are sent.
