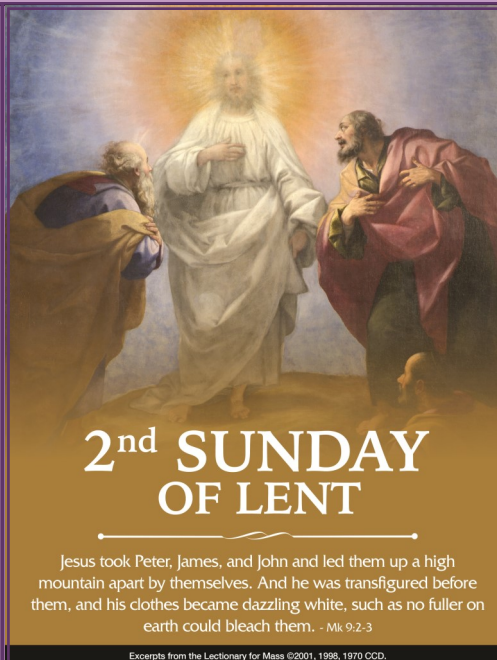

Lenten Season Regulations

The Lenten season is a time of renewal for the entire Catholic community.

It is also a time of spiritual accompaniment as we assist the catechumens and candidates who will be welcomed into communion with the Church at the Easter Vigil. In order to take full advantage of the Lenten season we would like to call your attention to the following:

Abstinence: all the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting: All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may also be taken on two other occasions during the day.

On Wednesday, March 14, 2018, Holy Family Parish will be holding our 22nd Annual Soup Supper. We invite you and your family, as well as friends to come to the school hall at 6p.m. to join us in a meager meal of soup, bread and water, instead of having your evening meal at home that night. In return, we ask that you give a small offering, perhaps the cost of your usual evening meal. This event is funded in whole by our sponsors and we appreciate any help you are able to give us to make this evening a success.

The donations we receive this year will be given to Helen Keller Services for the Blind. Since 1893, Helen Keller Services has been committed to improving the lives of individuals who are blind, visually impaired or have combined hearing and vision loss.

Low Vision Services at Helen Keller provides full eye examinations to ascertain the level of vision loss. The rehabilitation services can help make good use of what sight you have and help you improve the quality of your life. Managing your home can be a challenge when you have a vision loss, they will provide individualized rehabilitation and low vision services tailored to the specific needs of clients with the aim of helping them to regain self-sufficiency, restore their ability to function independently, and enhance their quality of life. Knowing where you are and how to get around is the key to maintaining an independent lifestyle. HKSB offers one-on-one training orientation and mobility, giving you the tools to familiarize yourself with environment and travel independently. HKSB helps one cope with vision-related changes in one's daily life. There are many blind and visually impaired people who rely on the programs at HKSB, please consider being a part of helping one of them.

The Confirmation candidates of Holy Family Parish will be helping as servers at this supper as part of their community service requirement. We urge everyone in the parish to join us on this evening or at least to make some sacrifices for those less fortunate during this Holy Season.
