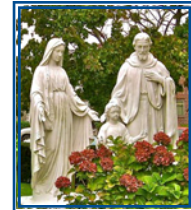

Dear Parishioners,

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King! Which is also known as the last Sunday of the Liturgical year. The purpose of this feast is to help us focus on the authority of Christ. In 1925, Pope Pius XI established this feast day in the life of the Church because secularism was just starting to grow in Europe and beyond.

The purpose of this feast today, is again to help us to reaffirm, reclaim, refocus our faith in the face of our secular society today.

My prayer for all of us on this Solemnity of Christ the King is to rediscover the joy of being a Christian again and to make this upcoming season of Advent worth-while, so that our celebration of Christmas may take on a newer and deeper meaning in our lives.

How can we do this? The first step is by avoiding complacency. Complacency seeps in all areas of our lives and affects the way we pray and worship. It can also affect the way the Church or the parish is run. Our passions, ambitions and desires can also be dampened by complacency.

To become complacent is to do the same thing over and over again with no desire to change or better ourselves. We are either growing closer to Christ or we are drifting away. We have to work at being a Christian every day. That means we can't just sit back and do nothing, we need to be actively involved.

So, this Advent, what are we willing to do differently to refocus and reclaim ourselves, so that we may avoid being complacent by rediscovering the joy of being a Christian again.
