Dear Parishioners,

Today, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates **Priesthood Sunday!** It's a day to reflect upon and affirm the role of the priesthood in your own lives and to pray for an increase in vocations to the Priesthood.

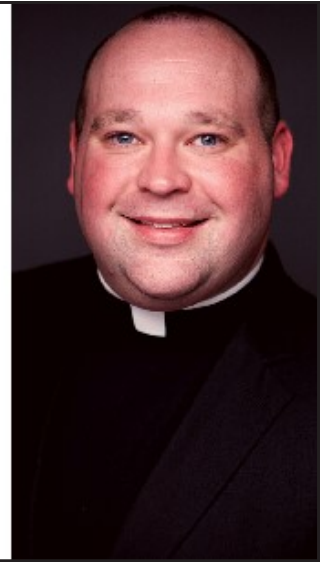
