times by appointment.

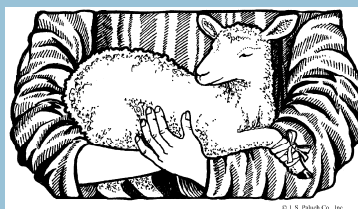
Baptisms: Please call the rectory to arrange the

Praised Be Jesus Christ!

Sometimes it just seems like everything is falling apart around us. Things can fall apart in our personal lives, family situations, parishes, in our country, and state. Most recently in regards to the Pro-Life movement the State of New York has passed laws which our very much against the sacredness of life. And in recent days we have seen so much scandal in our church too! When things fall apart do we say “Oh, well”, “Guess we lost” or should we try and regroup and regain our focus? As Catholics there is no better way of regaining our focus than before the Most Blessed Sacrament! “Lord, to whom shall we go?”

Since I have come to St. Josaphat’s we have had three days of Eucharistic Adoration. Two days this past November for the feast of St. Josaphat and we had one last week sponsored by some of our young adults. During these days of Eucharist Adoration not once was the church empty! At some hours, even in the snowy weather last week, the church had up to six people adoring; this was great to see! The devil wants churches closed so that the faithful cannot come before the Blessed Sacrament. Recently, I had a request to extend Eucharistic Adoration on First Fridays until mid-night, after the 7:30 PM Mass. We will experiment with this on this coming First Friday, March 1. But in the back of my mind I am thinking of offering Adoration all day on First Fridays from after the morning Mass until mid-night, perhaps in April which will give us a Eucharistic Day during Lent; April is also the month dedicated to the Blessed Sacrament. Please consider making time to adore Our Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament. If someone one would like to help me in organizing a list of people to adore our Lord so as to make sure Jesus is never alone, please let me know.
