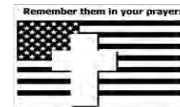

My dear parishioners,

As the weather gets warmer, and the sunshine brightens our days, it is more difficult for us to stay indoors and socially distance ourselves. We want to get out. We want to meet people. We want our lives to return to normal. We want to live our lives!

And yet we know that we still need to be cautious about spreading the Covid-19 virus around. Wearing masks and gloves, frequently washing our hands, keeping at least six feet apart, and get used to NOT greeting each other with a hug and a kiss (or even a handshake for that matter) can all take a tremendous toll on our social and psychological well being. Even those who are connected through social media can feel the effects of the isolation to which we are all sometimes subjected.

While we certainly hope and pray for an end to this current pandemic, it is worth noting that opportunities present themselves which we may not otherwise have. Spending time with family, and working on the most basic relationships in our lives is one such opportunity. I realize that this can be a challenge for many as we are forced to spend more time with our essential loved ones than we are used to, but it is also an opportunity to grow and get reacquainted with each other.

The same is true in our relationship with God. During this time I have found that I have more time for prayer and spiritual reading, and this has greatly improved my love for and commitment to my Heavenly Father, Jesus my Brother, and the Holy Spirit Who is the Bond of Love. This is the essential Relationship of every Christian, and just like our relationships with others, it needs to be worked on and nurtured. I have continuously encouraged you to pray the Rosary during this time of pandemic, and at all times, so that, like Mary our Blessed Mother, we may grow in our love for God, Who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We neglect this relationship at our own peril.

While we may for a time have to distance ourselves from others with whom we would very much like to be, let us not distance ourselves from God. He very much wants to be an intimate part of our lives. He constantly searches us out and calls upon us, especially in that empty and lonely place which is the wilderness of our hearts. There He invites us into His Divine Heart, which is where He wants us to make our home with Him.

Use the time given us wisely. And pray especially for those who have been so incredibly busy during this time taking care of the needs of others: healthcare workers, first responders, and other essential workers who sometimes put their very health and lives at risk to care for others. They occupy a special place in the Divine Heart of God because of the love they give to others.

Be well and be safe, and remember that you are in our prayers always. Fr. Frank and Fr. Peter

BULLETIN REFLECTION

Today, we celebrate the great feast of the Ascension of our Lord, that glorious moment when Jesus, 40 days after His resurrection, was lifted up — quite literally— into heaven, as the apostles watched in stunned amazement. It is recounted in both our first reading, from Acts, as well as the Gospel passage, from Matthew. It must have been an extraordinary thing to witness.



But the first reading tells us that the apostles were not permitted to simply bask in the moment for very long. “While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?'”

In other words, “Don’t just stand there, do something!”

This verse is a call to each one of us Christian stewards this very day. We have been given every grace and blessing through the Mass and all of the sacraments, through the Word of God, the rich teachings of our faith, and even our talents and our material possessions.

And like those first apostles, we are not meant to just stand here, but to do something with these gifts — in love and gratitude to the One Who gave them to us. We are called, just as much as the first apostles “to be [His] witnesses... to the ends of the earth,” not with our own power, but through the power of the Holy Spirit in us.
