Please remember that only 10 people will be permitted in the church at any given time, masks must be worn at all times, you may only sit in designated seats, no touching statues or lighting candles. The restroom will be locked and therefore is not available. Please follow the instructions of the volunteers who will be present in the church. IF I get a few more volunteers than I will be able to have the church open on Sundays

too. Please contact me at the rectory to volunteer for the open time slots.
