are required for all couples.

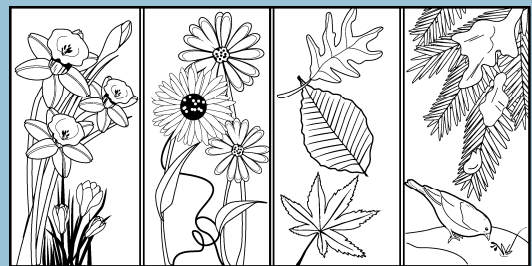
Ministry to the Sick: Sick calls and Communion

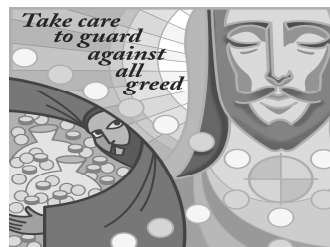

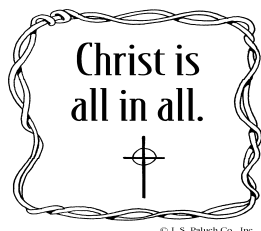

Priestly Life – part 4

The daily schedule of a priest generally consists of Mass, prayer, and appointments. Since the “duty system” is gone and you can’t expect to see a priest when you come to the rectory; the appointment system is the norm. Most appointments are for scheduling baptisms and weddings and doing the preparations for these two sacraments. In my seven years of being a priest I have not done too much counseling and that can be due to the need in my assignments. Daily schedules can change due to a funeral coming in and having to do the wake service. I will admit I missed one wake service due to a previous commitment and could not change my plans, the family was upset, but at the same time I did drop everything to offer the Sacrament of the Sick months before the person died. I should note that since our parish does not have care over any hospital or nursing home I don’t usually get called for emergencies. I have also seen a decline in getting emergency calls over my priesthood probably due to the changing views of families at the time of death; many don’t call the priest anymore. This is why I have been offering the Anointing of the Sick Mass several times during the year and anoint my homebound regularly.

Each day is a balancing game in some ways between prayer and appointments. There are also throughout the year diocesan meetings, deanery meetings, and parish meetings; maybe sometimes too many meetings! It is important for the priest to make sure he gets the prayer time in and to remember that prayer is his primary job. Generally speaking a priest is most busy during the morning and in the evening. But again, this varies from parish to parish.
