#### *Penance*

Every Saturday at 4:00pm—4:45pm (Also at anytime convenient upon request)

#### *Baptisms*

The second Saturday at 1pm and the last Sunday of the month at 2:00 p.m.s. Parents must speak to Deacon Stan one month in advance before the scheduled date. Due to Corvid19 restrictions parents and sponsors are not required at this time to attend an instruction class.

#### *Sacrament of the Sick Anointing of the Sick*

This sacrament is available for any baptized Catholic who is seriously ill or suffering the effects of advanced age. Please call the rectory to make an appointment for a priest to come to the home, or call anytime for a sudden illness. If serious surgery is scheduled, call to arrange for the anointing before you enter the hospital. A communal celebration of this sacrament is celebrated annually.

#### *Pastoral Care to the Homebound*

We are concerned about parishioners who are homebound and would like to receive the Eucharist, the Sacrament of Reconciliation or the Anointing of the Sick. If you are homebound, or if you know someone who is unable to come to Mass, please do not hesitate to contact the parish office at (718) 464-4582. Visits will be happily arranged for you.

Parents must also listen carefully to their children and observe both their children's activities and the behavior of older children and adults who interact with them. When children exhibit dramatic behavioral changes, adults must find out what caused the changes. Being aware of what's happening with our children means talking to, listening to, and observing them-at every opportunity. 

### SCHOOL IS OUT FOR SUMMER!

At long last school is out for summer! I know at that statement our young people rejoice and (some of) our adults cringe. But, summer is such a wonderful time to change the normal pace of life. For the kids hopefully the summer brings with it some rest and relaxation, time for fun and games, perhaps to go off to a camp; to do the things that they want to do and just be for a while. For families, there is usually some vacation time during the summer months— a chance to get away some place relaxing or even just stay home and go to the beach.

While American Martyrs never seems to get ‘less busy,’ the summer does bring with it a different kind of busyness. And, hopefully, by the time September rolls around, we’re all feeling a bit more refreshed and renewed.

I hope all of this is true for you and your family this year. One of the things I like about the Summer is that it provides an opportunity, not just for rest and relaxation, but also for retreat and a time to feed the soul. My hope is that we all find some time during these summer months as we do things to refresh our bodies and minds to let God refresh our souls. So, what can we all do? Here are a few suggestions:

1. Go to Mass during the week. As I always say, we’re here every day. Coming to Mass during the week is a great way, in a quiet environment, to fill yourself up with the grace that comes from the Eucharist. I love our summer Masses. There are one day retreat centers all around us where you can go and make a retreat. If you can’t afford that, come and spend a morning in our at St. Kateri Chapel before the Blessed Sacrament after the 9am Mass. Go for a prayerful walk in the park and pray the Rosary, (I pray the Rosary on my cell phone before listening music. Whatever you can do, we all need that time away from it all in God’s presence to renew us.
3. Spiritual Reading. There is nothing better than sitting down with a good book in the summer. Every year, I always look for three books. I like one of them to be a biography or autobiography, one of them to be just-for-fun (sports books are a favorite). And the third is always something spiritual. Find that spiritual book that will feed your soul this summer. I always recommend anything by Dr. Scott Hahn. If you’ve never read him, I recommend starting with The Lamb’s Supper. His books will change your life.

So, the question is simply this: What will you do for your spirit this summer? I pray that for every member of American Martyrs parish this is a summer of rest, relaxation and a renewal of body, mind and spirit.




