Sacrament of the Sick Anointing of the Sick

This sacrament is available for any baptized Catholic who is seriously ill or suffering the effects of advanced age. Please call the rectory to make an appointment for a priest to come to the home, or call anytime for a sudden illness. If serious surgery is scheduled, call to arrange for the anointing before you enter the hospital. A communal celebration of this sacrament is celebrated annually.


Call the Parish Office for information and appointment with a priest at least six months prior to the date you wish.

When children exhibit dramatic behavioral changes, adults must find out what caused the changes. Being aware of what's happening with our children means talking to, listening to, and observing them-at every opportunity. Today's Gospel reading is meant to shake us up a bit I think. In the reading, Jesus is asked to settle an inheritance problem between two brothers. In response, Jesus warns against greed and tells the parable of the rich man who has such an abundance of crop, that he is challenged as to what to do with it. He decides that it is best to tear down his old barns and build new, larger ones where all the grain can be safely stored providing him with comfort for many years to come. While this seems a bit greedy a solution, it isn't too surprising. How many of us would have decided to do the same thing?

Unfortunately for the rich man, God has other plans (as usual). The man loses his life that very night and all of his worrying about storing up more grain, more wealth, is in vain. It is out of his control.

In reading a reflection by Jack Shea (The Spiritual Wisdom of the Gospels for Christian Preachers and Teachers, Year C), I was struck by his thought that being "rich toward God" is like, "letting the grain grow right through your body without ever thinking of a barn." What a powerful image! We are to be so aware of God's grace and abundance, that we realize that it is all gift. We are to be stewards of all God's gifts of abundance. That is a constant challenge for us. How can we let the grain "grow through us?"

One way is to work at serving others with joy, looking to others needs rather than concentrating on our irritations. We are called to be the hands of God here on earth and that is no easy task. Serving others calls for commitment and time. It calls for the willingness to be the Martha's who do what they do because they are Mary's at the same time, serving because of a deep relationship with God.

This September American Martyrs will begin seeking dedicated people to serve as liturgical ministers. We will have a simple Ministry Fair after the 10:30 Mass (date to be determined,) you will be able to meet representatives of the different liturgical ministries and sign up to help. We will be seeking people for the following ministries: Altar Boys and Altar Girls, Weekday Adult Altar Servers, lectors; Eucharistic ministers; ushers; hospitality and greeters; and environment. Look for descriptions of these ministries in the weeks ahead.

When we serve each other, we let the grain grow through us. We do not worry about inconsequential things but in putting the comfort of someone else first. We do not hoard for ourselves. Instead we give freely to all.




